

RESOLUTION
(Trelina Solar Energy Center, LLC Project)

A regular meeting of Seneca County Industrial Development Agency on October 7, 2021, at 12:00 p.m. (noon).

The following resolution was duly offered and seconded, to wit:

Resolution No. 2021 – 21

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE SENECA COUNTY INDUSTRIAL DEVELOPMENT AGENCY (THE "AGENCY") TO (i) UNDERTAKE A CERTAIN PROJECT (AS DEFINED BELOW) FOR THE BENEFIT OF TRELINA SOLAR ENERGY CENTER, LLC (THE "COMPANY"), (ii) NEGOTIATE, EXECUTE AND DELIVER A LEASE AGREEMENT, LEASEBACK AGREEMENT, AGENT AGREEMENT, PAYMENT IN LIEU OF TAX AGREEMENT, AND RELATED DOCUMENTS, (iii) PROVIDE FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE TO THE COMPANY IN THE FORM OF (a) A SALES AND USE TAX EXEMPTION FOR PURCHASES AND RENTALS RELATED TO THE UNDERTAKING OF THE PROJECT, (b) A PARTIAL REAL PROPERTY TAX ABATEMENT UNDER A PAYMENT IN LIEU OF TAX AGREEMENT, AND (c) A MORTGAGE RECORDING TAX EXEMPTION FOR FINANCING RELATED TO THE PROJECT; AND (iv) EXECUTE A MORTGAGE AND RELATED DOCUMENTS

WHEREAS, by Title 1 of Article 18-A of the General Municipal Law of the State of New York, as amended, and Chapter 63 of the Laws of 1972 of the State of New York, as amended (hereinafter collectively called the "Act"), the SENECA COUNTY INDUSTRIAL DEVELOPMENT AGENCY (hereinafter, the "Agency") was created with the authority and power to own, lease and sell property for the purpose of, among other things, acquiring, constructing and equipping civic, industrial, manufacturing and commercial facilities as authorized by the Act; and

WHEREAS, Trelina Solar Energy Center, LLC a Delaware limited liability company, for itself or on behalf of an entity to be formed by it or on its behalf (the "Company") has submitted an application (the "Application"), a copy of which is on file with the Agency, requesting the Agency's assistance with respect to a certain project (the "Project") consisting of: (i) the acquisition of a leasehold interest in certain real property consisting of approximately 1,067 acres, including approximately nineteen separate tax parcels, located on or in the vicinity of Packwood Road, Serven Road and Pre-emption Road in the Town of Waterloo, Seneca County, New York (the "Land"), (ii) the construction on the Land of commercial-scale solar arrays, access roads, electric collection lines, a collection substation, electrical interconnection facilities and other components necessary for the generation of approximately 79.5 to 80 MWac of electricity for interconnection with the existing NYSEG electric grid, with related amenities (collectively, the "Improvements"), and (iii) the acquisition and installation by the Company in and around the Improvements of certain items of equipment and other tangible personal property (the "Equipment" and, collectively with the Land and the Improvements, the "Facility"); and

WHEREAS, by resolution adopted on September 2, 2021 (the "Inducement Resolution"), the Agency (i) accepted the Application, and (ii) directed that a public hearing be held pursuant to General Municipal Law section 859-a; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to General Municipal Law section 859-a, on September 22, 2021, at 12:00 p.m. at 66 Virginia Street, Waterloo, New York, the Agency held a public hearing with respect to the Project and the proposed Financial Assistance (as defined in the Inducement Resolution) being contemplated by the Agency (the "Public Hearing") whereat interested parties were provided a reasonable opportunity, both orally and in writing, to present their views; and

WHEREAS, copies of the minutes of the Public Hearing, written submissions and the notice of the Public Hearing published and forwarded to the affected taxing jurisdictions at least then (10) days prior to said Public Hearing are attached hereto as Exhibit A; and

WHEREAS, the Agency has prepared a cost-benefit analysis with respect to the Project and the contemplated Financial Assistance and has reviewed the results of said cost-benefit analysis; and

WHEREAS, in reviewing the Application, the Agency has considered (i) the nature of the Project, (ii) the economic condition of the area and the multiplying effect the Project will have on the area; (iii) the extent to which the Project will create permanent, private sector jobs; (iv) the estimated value of tax exemptions contemplated to be provided; (v) the economic impact of the Project and proposed tax exemptions on affected taxing jurisdictions; (vi) the impact of the Project on existing and proposed businesses and economic development projects in the vicinity of the Project; (vii) the amount of private sector investment likely to be generated by the Project; (viii) the extent to which the Project will require the provision of additional services; (ix) the extent to which the Project will provide additional sources of revenue for the municipalities and school district in which the Project is located; and (x) the benefit of the Project not otherwise available to the area in which the Project is located; and

WHEREAS, the Agency desires to adopt a resolution (i) acknowledging that the Public Hearing was held in compliance with the Act, (ii) authorizing Financial Assistance to the Company in excess of \$100,000, (iii) authorizing the execution and delivery of the Lease Agreement, the Leaseback Agreement, the Agent Agreement, the PILOT Agreement (as all of the foregoing are defined in the Inducement Resolution) and all documents related thereto (collectively, the "Transaction Documents"), and (iv) authorizing the execution and delivery of one or more mortgages and related documents related to the financing of the Project.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MEMBERS OF THE AGENCY AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The Agency hereby finds and determines:

(a) By virtue of the Act, the Agency has been vested with all powers necessary and convenient to carry out and effectuate the purposes and provisions of the Act and to exercise all powers granted to it under the Act; and

(b) The Project will promote employment opportunities and prevent economic deterioration in Seneca County, and otherwise further the purposes of the Agency, and that by entering into the PILOT Agreement and otherwise providing financial assistance for the Project the Agency will be increasing employment opportunities in Seneca County and otherwise furthering the purposes of the Act; and

(c) The Project will encourage renewable energy and, promote and maintain the job opportunities, general prosperity and economic welfare of the citizens of the County of Seneca and State of New York, improve their standard of living, and prevent economic deterioration in Seneca County, and as such the Project constitutes a "renewable energy" and "commercial" facility as contemplated by the Act; and

(d) The leasing of the Facility from and the subleasing back of the Facility to the Company will promote and maintain job opportunities, health, general prosperity and economic welfare of the citizens of the County of Seneca and State of New York and improve their standard of living and thereby serve the public purposes of the Act; and

(e) Based upon the representations and warranties of the Company, the Project is an action requiring a certificate of environmental compatibility and public need under article 10 of the New York State Public Service Law; and

(f) Based upon the representations and warranties of the Company, the Facility and the operations conducted thereon will not cause or result in the violation of the health, labor or other laws of the United States of America, the State of New York or the County of Seneca; and

(g) It is desirable and in the public interest for the Agency to acquire an interest in the Facility; and

(h) The Lease Agreement will be an effective instrument whereby the Company leases the Facility to the Agency; and

(i) The Leaseback Agreement will be an effective instrument whereby the Agency subleases the Facility back to the Company; and

(j) The PILOT Agreement will be an effective instrument whereby the Agency and the

Company set forth the terms and conditions of their agreement regarding the Company's payment of payments in lieu of real property taxes; and

(k) The Agent Agreement will be an effective instrument whereby the Agency and the Company set forth the terms and conditions of their agreement regarding the Agency's appointment of the Company as its agent for the Project; and

(l) The Public Hearing held by the Agency on September 22, 2021 concerning the Project and the Financial Assistance was duly held in accordance with the Act, including but not limited to the giving of at least ten (10) days published notice of the Public Hearing (such notice also provided to the Chief Executive Officer of each affected tax jurisdiction), affording interested parties a reasonable opportunity, both orally and in writing, to present their views with respect to the Project; and

Section 2. In consequence of the foregoing, the Agency hereby determines to (a) acquire a leasehold interest in the facility pursuant to the Lease Agreement, (b) sublease the Facility back to the Company pursuant to the Leaseback Agreement, (c) authorize the undertaking of the Project and appoint the Company as its agent for purposes of acquiring, constructing and/or equipping the Facility, subject to the Company entering into the Agent Agreement, and (d) provide financial assistance for the Project in the form of (i) a sales and use tax exemption for purchases and rentals related to the undertaking of the Project, subject to the terms and conditions of the Agent Agreement, the total value of the exemption not to exceed \$1,100,000, (ii) a partial real property tax abatement, subject to the terms and conditions of the PILOT Agreement, and (iii) a mortgage recording tax exemption for financing related to the Project.

Section 3. The foregoing resolutions notwithstanding, the Agency's appointment of the Company as its agent for purposes of undertaking the Project is subject to and conditioned upon the Company's agreement, in accordance with Section 875(3) of the New York General Municipal Law, that, if the Company receives New York State and local sales and use tax exemption benefits ("sales and use tax exemption benefits") from the Agency, and it is determined that: (i) the Company is not entitled to the sales and use tax exemption benefits; (ii) the sales and use tax exemption benefits are in excess of the amounts authorized by the Agency to be taken by the Company; (iii) the sales and use tax exemption benefits are for property or services not authorized by the Agency as part of the Project; or (iv) the sales and use tax exemption benefits are taken in cases where the Company fails to comply with a material term or condition to use property or services in the manner approved by the Agency in connection with the Project, then the Company will (A) cooperate with the Agency in its efforts to recover or recapture any sales and use tax exemption benefits, and (B) promptly pay over any such amounts to the Agency that the Agency demands in connection therewith, and that in the event that the Company fails to pay over such amounts to the Agency, the New York State Tax Commissioner may assess and determine New York State and local sales and use taxes due from the Company, together with any relevant penalties and interest due on such amounts.

Section 4. The foregoing resolutions notwithstanding, the Agency's approval of the Financial Assistance is subject to the following conditions and limitations, which shall be set forth in the Transaction Documents as applicable:

(a) Final issuance of a certificate of environmental compatibility and public need under article 10 of the New York State Public Service Law.

Section 5. The Chairman, Vice Chairman and/or the Executive Director of the Agency are hereby authorized, on behalf of the Agency, to execute and deliver the Transaction Documents in substantially the forms presented to this meeting, and all documents related thereto, with such additions, changes, variations, omissions and insertions as the Chairman, Vice Chairman and/or Executive Director, shall approve, which agreements may provide for the forfeiture and/or recapture of financial assistance where projected employment goals have not been met. The execution thereof by the Chairman, Vice Chairman and/or Executive Director of the Agency shall constitute conclusive evidence of such approval.

Section 6. The Chairman, Vice Chairman and/or Executive Director of the Agency are hereby

authorized , on behalf of the Agency, to execute and deliver any mortgage, assignment of leases and rents, security agreement, UCC-1 Financing Statements and all documents reasonably contemplated by these resolutions and required by any lender or financial institution identified by the Company providing financing for the Project, all with such changes, variations, omissions and insertions as the Chairman, Vice Chairman and/or Executive Director of the Agency shall approve, the execution thereof by the Chairman, Vice Chairman and/or Executive Director of the Agency to constitute conclusive evidence of such approval, provided in all events recourse against the Agency is limited to the Agency's interest in the Project.

Section 7. The officers, employees and agents of the Agency are hereby authorized and directed for and in the name and on behalf of the Agency to do all acts and things required to execute and deliver all such certificates, instruments and documents, to pay all such fees, charges and expenses and to do all such further acts and things as may be necessary or, in the opinion of the officer, employee or agent acting, desirable and proper to effect the purposes of the foregoing resolutions and to cause compliance by the Agency with all of the terms, covenants and provisions of the documents executed for and on behalf of the Agency.

Section 8. These Resolutions shall take effect immediately.

The question of the adoption of the foregoing Resolutions was duly put to a vote on roll call, which resulted as follows:

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A public hearing on assistance being extended to Trelina Solar, was opened by Sarah Davis, Executive Director of the Seneca County IDA, at 12:00 PM. Attendees are listed above. Mrs. Davis read the public hearing in its entirety.

The following comments were received:

Mr. Emery Oese-Siegel, owner of land which is a part of the project:

Mr. Oese-Siegel spoke in support of the project noting that the funds the landowners receive will help maintain the farms for generations. The project, while still allowing the growing of crops, will also allow the harvesting of the sun's energy and bring lots of jobs and other monies to the community. He also noted that there is money set aside for the removal of all the panels at the end of their life. They will not be using concrete to install but using fenceposts that can be easily removed. Once the solar panels have reached the end of their life they land will then be turned back to farmland.

Ms. Roberta "Bobby" Oese-Siegel, owner of land which is a part of the project:

Ms. Oese-Siegel spoke in support of the project. The project will allow the landowners to have the funds to farm other lands that might be going into other types of development. It's important that we keep as much land around us in a natural condition. The project will be following the very strict guidelines of the flora and fauna that they have to maintain. There are at least six certified grass seeds that will go into the land that the panels will be lying on as well as trees that will border the panel sites. These additional trees and grass, which are native to the area and to the region, may also increase the amount of flora and fauna that we naturally see. In addition, the funds are allowing us to preserve more farmland by buying a sister farm. Something that doesn't always get pointed out is that we are 2.8 miles from the city of Geneva, and we are holding strong but not putting up extra lights or using up extra energy as certain large economic projects do. The Town and County are being guaranteed a handsome income over the next 25 years as well as a natural habitat for everybody to still enjoy. I am also pleased that about the number of jobs for our young men and women who are journeymen in the electrical field. This opportunity will allow them to gain a strong foothold of skill and talent in putting in solar panels throughout the state. Also the change in the climate is affecting farmers. We are having to deal with a ton of new conditions like insects, fungus and temperature changes. If we don't address these issues, we may not have all the land to produce a good food supply. We are in a very good place to keep doing that in upstate New York

Mr. Andrew Hanson, member of the local 840 IBEW and Waterloo resident:

Mr. Hanson spoke in support of the project. This will be a great experience for the younger generation. There are a lot of excited young minds out there ready to jump in on this project. As we are pushing slowly but surely towards more green energy in this world, these are kind of projects that we'd like to see more of, not only the solar power but other alternative energies. Another positive is that the project will be locally built, and the monies are going to stay local.

Mr. Tom Irizzo, representing the United Brotherhood Carpenters Local 277;

Mr. Irizzo asked if a local labor policy will be put in place. He has seen many solar projects around the state being done by laborers outside the state of New York. Mrs. Davis noted that the IDA does have a local labor policy in place that applies to all projects that receive IDA assistance. She also noted that she believes there has been discussions regarding labor agreements between the developer and the local unions; however, the IDA has not been involved in those discussions. Mr. Irizzo asked if there will be a Minority and Woman Hiring requirement with the project? Mrs. Davis responded by saying she will follow up on that

Mr. Jason Swartley, local business owner:

Mr. Swartley spoke in support of the project. He noted that he is a financial planner and advisor to a lot of the local businesses and family farms in the area. He has been a business owner here all his life and comes from an agriculture background, having family farms for many years. He stated projects like this help support the local area the jobs. The money from these projects gets spent over time within the community and has a huge impact in the region as a whole. As a member of the Farm Bureau, he stated that they have spoken in support of the project as well as have many farmers in the area.

Dr. Suzanne McNally

Dr. McNally spoke in support of the project. Solar projects like this help farmers by giving them multiple feet on the ground. They give the diversity, so that problems in one area don't wipe out a farm completely. It is also a good thing for the land. It will leave it in better shape as it will have rested for a long time. It will come back filled with organisms purified of any pollutants. This is a healthy response to climate change. This provision of really clean energy is something that we can do to try to tamp down climate change.

Ms. Alice DiDona, Resident

Ms. DiDona spoke in support of the project. Some of her land is involved in the project and the company has been wonderful. They have made sure there weren't any endangered animals on the site of the project. Her property has been in her family for many years and her aunt always use to say "the land will always take care of you." Ms. DiDona hopes that everything the company has done, and their record, proves that they are a good project for this area. She also hopes that the jobs that will be created and the tax revenue that will be received will be a good incentive for the approval of the project.

There were no written comments. Mrs. Davis closed the hearing at 12:22pm

Trelina Solar Energy Center, LLC, on behalf of itself and/or an entity formed or to be formed on its behalf (collectively, the "Company") has applied to the Agency to enter into a transaction in which the Agency will assist in (i) the acquisition of a leasehold interest in certain real property consisting of approximately 1,067 acres, including approximately nineteen separate tax parcels, located on or in the vicinity of Packwood Road, Serven Road and Pre-emption Road in the Town of Waterloo, Seneca County, New York (the "Land"), (ii) the construction on the Land of commercial-scale solar arrays, access roads, electric collection lines, a collection substation, electrical interconnection facilities and other components necessary for the generation of approximately 79.5 to 80 MWac of electricity for interconnection with the existing NYSEG electric grid, with related amenities (collectively, the "Improvements"), and (iii) the acquisition and installation by the Company in and around the Improvements of certain items of equipment and other tangible personal property (the "Equipment" and, collectively with the Land and the Improvements, the "Facility");.

The initial owner of the Facility will be the Company. The Agency will acquire a subleasehold interest in the Facility from the Company and lease the Facility back to the Company. At the end of the lease term, the Agency will terminate its leasehold interest. The Agency contemplates it will provide financial assistance to the Company in the form of exemptions from sales and use taxes, exemptions from mortgage recording taxes and abatement of property taxes.

A representative of the Agency will at the above-stated time and place hear and accept written comments from all persons with views in favor of or opposed to either the proposed financial assistance to the Company or the location or nature of the Facility.
