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**Seneca County IDA to Hold Meeting for Prospective Buyers of Depot Land**

*Dec. 15 meeting will offer information specific to interested buyers*

**WATERLOO, N.Y., NOV. 30, 2015** – With the Seneca County Industrial Development Agency (IDA) in the process of selling the remaining, approximately 7,000 acres of the former Seneca Army Depot, prospective buyers will have their chance to gather more detailed information and tour the Depot property in mid-December.

As a follow-up to a public information meeting held on Nov. 7, the IDA will hold a meeting for prospective buyers only at 10 a.m. on Tuesday, Dec. 15, at the Romulus Fire Hall, 2010 Cayuga St., in the town of Romulus, Seneca County. As part of the Dec. 15 meeting, IDA officials will provide more details to buyers regarding the formal Invitation for Bids, which is expected to be finalized late this week.

“Since the public meeting earlier this month, the IDA has heard from several parties that plan to bid on all or part of the Depot property,” said IDA Executive Director Bob Aronson. “In an effort to encourage buyers to submit accurate and complete bids, the IDA will lead a tour and answer any questions that buyers may have about the land or the sale process.”

The Dec. 15 meeting will include a driving tour of the former Depot. Prospective buyers will have the chance to see some of the existing infrastructure, including igloos, roads, and sections of railroad track.

“The IDA will consider every proposal with the expectation that the future buyer or buyers will revitalize this unique piece of land,” Aronson said. “We are eager to see this land returned to the tax rolls and become an economic asset to the County.”

The tentative deadline for submission of bids is Monday, Feb. 29, 2016.
